TOWNSHIP OF MARATHON

Plumbing and Mechanical Code Enforcement Ordinance No. 80-3

An Ordinance to designate the Township of Marathon as the enforcement agency for the Michigan Plumbing Code and the Michigan Mechanical Code, in accordance with the revisions of Public Act 230 of 1972 as amended.

THE TOWNSHIP OF MARATHON ORDAINS:

Section 1. The Township of Marathon is hereby designated the enforcing agency for the Michigan Plumbing Code as promulgated by the Michigan Construction Code Commission pursuant to Public Act 230 of 1972 as amended.

Section 2. The Township of Marathon is hereby designated the enforcing agency for the Michigan Mechanical Code as promulgated by the Michigan Construction Code Commission pursuant to Public Act 230 of 1972 as amended.

Section 3. The Marathon Township Board shall appoint appropriately individuals to serve as inspectors and enforcement officers of Plumbing and Mechanical Codes.

Section 4. All fees for permits, bonds and inspections required pursuant to the enforcement of the Plumbing and Mechanical Codes shall be established by motion of the Marathon Township Board.

Section 5. Any person who shall violate a provision of the Plumbing Code or Mechanical Code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.00 or by imprisonment not exceeding ninety (90) days or both such fine or imprisonment. Each day that a violation continues shall be deemed as a separate offense.

Section 6. The former Marathon Township Ordinance Number 7, being an ordinance adopting the Uniform Plumbing Code on May 13, 1975, is hereby repealed in its entirety. All other ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are also repealed to the extent of the conflict.

Section 7. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after the date of publication.
